Child care and refreshments are served. (Bonnie Raine)</p>	<p>Community Alternatives: Caregiver training is one of the supports that can be offered for parents of children and adolescents with very significant emotional, behavioral or mental health needs who qualify for the Community Alternatives program. (Beth Hostetler).</p> <p>Outpatient Therapy: Provides therapeutic intervention to children and adolescents in need of mental health resources, tailored to the needs of the individual, and may include family counseling or therapy.</p> <p>Cost depends on the nature and length of services. Insurance, including Medicaid, is accepted. (Access Center)</p>	<p>Supervised Visitation: Requires DCS referral.
